### Monthly Reports

Regional EMS Steering Committee Report: No meeting

Fire Company: David Fink commented his report will be about the fire tax under old business. Randy Metzger reported a tree down on lines on Bake Oven Road this past weekend. PPL cut their sections off lines and left; Verizon did not come to clear their lines. Penn DOT does not remove trees from utility lines. There is general concern as to how to address the issue of Verizon not removing trees from their lines. The Board of Supervisors requested Janice write a letter to the PUC and Verizon.

Director of Office Operations: Forrest Wessner III reported the office is running smoothly. Kathy attended an accessibility class for continuing education credits.

Director of Parks and Recreation: Steve Bachman reported on the recreation commission meeting. The recreation commission is searching for a top dressing machine. The next meeting is June 26, 2013.

Director of Public Works: David Fink commented on the summer workload for the road crew. David Fink made a motion to recommend hiring Jonathan Pasieka, as part time road crew, at the rate of \$15.00 an hour, and starting immediately. Forrest Wessner III seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Road Superintendent: Kevin Huber reported they have done mowing, grading, and working on Rex Road Bridge. The grant is finished for the second part of Jones Road. They are repairing equipment in house. The oil and chipping has been set back due to rain.

Township Administrator: Janice Bortz reported the Tough Mudder event went smoothly and the other municipalities had no issues either. She will send a letter to Mr. Jaindl on the issues that were of concern. Janice recommended the township look into an ordinance for a "Large Gathering Event". She attended a conference at the Lehigh County Government Center on recycling and DA Jim Martin commented that he is in favor of regional county wide police force. Lehigh County Emergency Management has a new manager, Scott Lindenmuth. The Heidelberg/Lynn EIT's final audit is in process. Janice met with John Barry concerning the renewal of the township's vehicle and liability insurance; which is renewed. Laura Hopek with Lehigh County Conservation District has twenty gallons of paint available through a grant with the conservation district. SWIFT, the workers compensation insurance for fire fighters, fire police, and part time janitor has gone from \$8000.00 to \$12,700.00 for 2013-14.

Township Zoning Officer: Roy Stewart gave a report on permits that were issued and complaints that were handled.

Township Engineer: Gave the Board of Supervisors his report.

Environmental Advisory Council Report: Janice Bortz reported for the EAC that they had a plant sale on June 8<sup>th</sup> at the township building. The EAC made \$148.50 at the plant sale to be used towards a scholarship for a NWLSD high school student.

### Old Business

Fire Tax: David Fink reported he met with Kaye Fronheiser from the fire company and reviewed accounts pertaining to operating the fire company. David Fink gave a ball park figure pertaining to the gross operating expense for the Fire Company and social hall.

Resident Carl Breininger recommended a meeting with Gary Day and the State Police; due to the comment that was made by Rep. Day at his public meeting that "this new gambling law should create more revenue".

Atty. Strohl commented that the procedure for adopting the fire tax could be a resolution which requires three consecutive weeks of advertisement and at the end of the year a resolution is done for the millage. The fire company would have to give the township a report showing where the prior year's funds were spent before the township would release money.

There was general discussion among the residents concerning cost of new equipment, repairs, and residents being able to pay their taxes.

David Fink made a motion requesting Atty. Strohl develop a fire tax draft resolution and to set a maximum of one mill. Forrest Wessner III seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Werleys Corner Road update: Janice Bortz met with Jeff Rohrbach from Penn DOT and he recommended the Board of Supervisors sign the partial abandonment form for the section of Werleys Corner Road from Route 100 to the creek. David Fink made a motion to accept the Penn DOT form abandoning Route 4019 - Section 01B – Lehigh County – Station 120+0000 to Station 120+1334. Forrest Wessner III seconded the motion. Motion carried.

David Fink made a motion to close Werleys Corner Road from PA. State Route 100 to the creek but allow current property owners access. Forrest Wessner III seconded the motion. Motion carried.
