The Heidelberg Township Board of Supervisors held their regular meeting at 7:30pm at the Municipal Building, 6272 Route 309, New Tripoli, PA 18066. Present were Supervisors Steve Bachman, David Fink and Rodney Schlauch Jr., Administrator/Secretary-Treasurer Janice Meyers, Road Superintendent Kevin Huber, Zoning Assistant Tara Jones, Township Solicitor Atty. Keith Strohl from Steckel and Stopp Law Offices and Township Engineer Ryan Christman from Keystone Consulting Engineers. Tara Jones kept record of the minutes.

Township Administrator: Janice Meyers reported that Keystone Technology moved the EIT computers to Lynn Township. She reported on her attendance at the PSATS Conference. ADT began installation of the security system.



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Township Zoning Officer: Ryan Christman presented the zoning officer report to the Board. Township Engineer: Ryan Christman reviewed the engineer's report with the Board. He reported that the Jones Road Culvert permits are progressing.

#### Old Business:

Proposed changes to ordinances: Keith Strohl reported that the ordinance change will be ready for adoption next month.

Lease for Central Road cell tower site: The Board agreed that the \$300 for additional receivers would only apply to new additions. Atty. Strohl will finalize the paperwork for next meeting.

Recycling at NWLSD: Janice Meyers received a call from Tammy Meckes, Arthur Oakes secretary. The NWLSD is in the process of implementing a recycling program. Janice Meyers will check back with the school district in six months.

Township Recycling: Janice Meyers spoke with Harold Miller from Berger Sanitation and he suggested that we do not accept commercial recyclables. There would be a substantial cost for a 7<sup>th</sup> bin. The Board agreed that we will not accept commercial recyclables. Janice Meyers will send letters to those businesses using our recycling center. Kevin Huber and Janice Meyers will work together on the wording for the "do's and don't's" sign. Steve Bachman will look into a blue bin for plastic bags. Janice Meyers was instructed to contact Att. Waters's office regarding the littering ordinance.

Yard Waste Survey: Janice Meyers will contact Washington Twp. regarding cost of sharing their facility. She will also contact the DEP regarding their recommendation for uses of yard waste. The Board would like to do a yard waste survey in the next newsletter.

Employee Handbook: The Board instructed Janice Meyers to look into free software to convert a pdf into a word document for June's meeting.

Special Event / Amusement Tax Ordinance: Roy Stewart will have samples for May's meeting.

Review joint road oil bid: Motion by Rodney Schlauch Jr., seconded by David Fink to accept the low bid from Midland Asphalt Materials Inc. for 25,000 gallons of CRS-2PME-3M road oil at \$2.013 /gallon, total cost \$50,325.00. Motion carried. Other bidders were Asphalt Maintenance Solutions LLC at \$2.09 /gallon and Dosch King Emulsions Inc. at \$2.16 /gallon.

Review application for addition to Agricultural Security Area: Motion by David Fink, seconded by Rodney Schlauch Jr. to table the application for the ASA from Kevin and Darlene Smith for a total of 78.5 acres. Motion carried.

Quotes for windows: Tabled until next meeting.

Tax bills: David Fink requested a SOP (Standard Operating Procedure) for the processing of monthly assessment changes. Motion by David Fink, seconded by Steve Bachman for Rodney Schlauch Jr., Janice Meyers and Tara Jones to meet and create the SOP. Motion carried.

<u>Public Comment:</u> The Board of Supervisors agreed to use a similar Escrow agreement for Dirty Girl as they did with Tough Mudder.

The Board of Supervisors asked Kevin Huber to measure the EIT office and post the availability of office space on the township bulletin board out front. Janice Meyers will post the information on the website.
