Monthly Reports

Regional EMS Steering Committee Report: No report was given.

Fire Company: David Fink reported that the hot wing and cheesesteak fundraiser held at the Germansville Fire Company had a great turnout.

Ambulance Service: Joe Solderich, NOVA's executive director gave NOVA's first quarter status report for 2015 which included the time between February 1, 2015 to March 31, 2015. Heidelberg Township, which is referred to as the "West Station", had 102 total dispatches. Joe Solderich informed the Board on the response times from time of dispatch to on-scene for patients treated and/or transported. The average response time was 8.22 minutes, 1.0 minute being the minimum and 15.0 minutes being the maximum. Joe Solderich reported on the number of day dispatches vs night dispatches by station. Director of Office Operations: No report was given.

Director of Parks and Recreation: Steve Bachman reported that the NW Recreation Commission will be putting the money donated by Nestle Park toward a walking path. He also mentioned that the storage sheds for the Rec Fields is tabled until next year and the annual "walk around" was held on March 29, 2015.

Director of Public Works: The Board of Supervisors and Kevin Huber decided that Thursday, April 23, 2015 from 4:30 to 5:00pm will be the annual road inspection.

Road Superintendent: Kevin Huber reported that the road department worked on coal patching black top roads and crack sealing. The road department finished sweeping, cut trees on Church Road and Sensinger Road, graded and cut shoulders on the dirt roads. Also, the road department placed signs and painted arrows at Hunters Hill Road and Central Road. The orange triangles were placed on the speed limit signs as well.

Township Administrator: Janice Meyers reported that permitting has become more consistent and steady over the past few weeks and Tara Jones has been updating files. Janice Meyers worked on the various agenda items and deferred comment.

Township Zoning Officer: Chris Noll, from Keystone Consulting Engineers, reviewed Roy Stewart's Zoning Officer Report. The office continues to follow through on complaints and zoning violation letters.

Township Engineer: The Engineer's Report consisted of the current projects which include the Jones Road Culvert, Werleys Corner Road Culvert, Reservoir Road Culvert and the No Parking Ordinance. For both the Jones Road Culvert and Werleys Corner Road Culvert, the bids have been received and are currently being reviewed for completeness prior to awarding the contract. For the Jones Road Culvert, the apparent low bidder is Sikora Bros. Paving Inc. from Hunlock Creek, PA with the low bid of \$166,500. For the Werleys Corner Road Culvert, the apparent low bidder is Dirt Works Solutions from Slatington, PA with the low bid of \$160,064. The bids will be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors at the May meeting. The survey work has been completed for the Reservoir Road Culvert project. The cross-sections are being finalized for the HEC-RAS hydraulic modeling and the plans are in being finalized. Regarding the No Parking Ordinance, an exhibit has been prepared to show the proposed no parking zones in the Heidelberg Heights area and Chris Noll will speak with Kevin Huber and Keith Strohl about Kevin's request to add roads.

Environmental Advisory Council Report: Resident Charles Perich reported that the EAC will need a check for the 2015 scholarship recipient. Janice Meyers read an email that she received from EAC member Dawn Didra regarding the EAC's upcoming events. In the email, the EAC decided on a scholarship recipient and asked the Board of Supervisors for approval for a \$100.00 check to be presented to the scholarship winner. The presentation will take place on May 18, 2015. There were a total of 4 applicants and they all did a great job. The EAC is planning a Clean-up day at Bake Oven Knob on June 13, 2015 from 9:00am to 12:00pm. They are requesting that the information be put on the Heidelberg Township sign the week of the clean-up. The EAC is also asking if Heidelberg Township could provide large garbage bags and if the township could dispose of the garbage collected, especially the non-recyclable garbage. A guest speaker is scheduled to talk about pollinators at the July 14, 2015 EAC meeting.

Monetary amount not to exceed \$250.00 which includes one night hotel stay, mileage, registration and one meal. Motion carried. All other meals are included with registration.

Parade: Steve Bachman requested the use of the OshKosh Truck as well as a Heidelberg Township road department employee to drive it in the Goodwill Fire Company #1 parade held on July 11, 2015 at 2:00pm. Kevin Huber will ask the road department employees if anyone is interested in being a driver. Steve Bachman mentioned that the fire company is looking for more participants to help make the celebration a success. The deadline to participate is May 1, 2015.

Berger Sanitation: A Berger Sanitation representatives Rob Berger and Harold Miller discussed the contract renewal with the Board of Supervisors. In 2008, the original contract included 4 recycling bins and 2x weekly pickup at \$215.00 per month. Currently, the contract includes 6 recycling bins and 3x weekly pickup at \$215.00 per month. The new 3-year contract includes 6 recycling bins and 3x weekly pickup at \$775.00 per month (\$560.00 increase). Steve Bachman asked if the contract can be cancelled before the 3-year renewal period with a 90 day notice without any cause. Mr. Berger agreed. Motion by David Fink, seconded by Steve Bachman to accept the contract renewal with addendum which allows Heidelberg Township to cancel its 3-year contract anytime as long as it gives 90 day notice. Motion carried.

State Conference—Supervisor Lost Wages: Discussion ensued regarding the pay rate. Motion by Steve Bachman, seconded by Rodney Schlauch Jr. to authorize payment of the Supervisors hourly rate as defined by the auditors for part-time road masters. (2 yes, 1 no – David Fink) Motion carried.

NWLSD/Ambulance Service: David Fink said he received an email that confirmed that NOVA will be the primary Ambulance service and have full jurisdiction over the entire Northwestern Lehigh School District campus. The Board of Supervisors requested that Janice Meyers draft a letter and send it to Dan Bellesfield at the Lehigh County 9-1-1 Communications Center as well as Lynn Township.

<u>Public Comment:</u> Mark Smith, NOVA EMT, asked the Board for clarification regarding the NWLSD Ambulance Service. Steve Bachman reiterated saying that, yes, the issue is resolved.
